

Research Interns may take unpaid leave during the internship. Leave must be approved by the supervisor, and Interns must submit a leave notice. Such leave should not hinder research activities in any way.

Visa Status

Those who have a "cultural activities" valid for three months CANNOT re-enter Japan without a re-entry permit. *If you wish to travel abroad during you are at OIST, consult with us before making any travel arrangements.

Flight

Arrival and departure date to and from Okinawa are set by OIST to be close as possible to your internship term and will be confirmed prior to flight arrangements. As such, you must leave Okinawa after your internship period ends, and you may not extend your stay or arrive earlier than the designated dates.



Accommodation


Research interns will be provided with shared, furnished on-campus housing during the internship period. *No amenities (toilet paper, towels, etc.) are provided in the room. We recommend that you bring enough to last a few days. For more information about housing, please check the furniture list. **There will be possibility OIST request you to move to a different room due to the room availability.

Internship Allowance

Internship Allowance

OIST will provide 2,400 Japanese Yen* (JPY) per workday.

*Basically taxable 20.42%(Non-resident), 10.21%(Resident), but currently no taxes are imposed.

Payment day

Payments are scheduled no earlier than the end of the following month (around two months after your start date at OIST), Please note that the payment schedule is subject to change.

Payment method

Payment will be made via wire transfer to <u>your bank account in your home</u> country and will NOT be paid in cash. Please note that wire transfer usually taka bout one week to process.

Important

Please bring at least two months' worth of living expenses in Japanese yen.

- Average living expenses are 50,000 JPY per month.
- Around Onna village, it may be difficult to exchange foreign currency. <u>Please convert</u> the money before arriving to Okinawa.

Do not forget to bring Japanese yen in Cash

Internship Allowance

The internship allowance will be paid directory to your bank account in your home country. Once you receive "OIST guest registration" e-mail, please provide your bank information. *Please note that you cannot open a Japanese bank account.

[Important Note: Bank Information]

- The bank account has to be under your name.
 OIST does not pay the allowance into someone else's bank account.
- Please note that it is <u>NOT</u> possible to open a Japanese bank account while on a short-term stay status in Japan.
- Before coming to Japan, please confirm that your bank can receive wire transfer from Japan and that your cash card is accepted at Japanese banks, otherwise, OIST cannot process your allowance payment.
- We recommend bringing several bank account details, cash cards, and credit cards with you when traveling to Okinawa, for your convenience.

(Required for RIs staying more than three months in Japan. The insurance fee is at the RI's own expense.)

1 Travel Insurance (inbound)

When OIST provides a round-trip ticket to Research Interns or Visiting Research Students (RI/VRS), they will be covered by **travel insurance**.

*If OIST does not provide a round-trip ticket, RI/VRS must provide proof of insurance to OIST prior to arrival.

補 頂 の 概 要 Summary of Coverage

- Please note that when you visit a doctor, <u>you will need to pay</u> the medical fee in cash upfront. This travel insurance only covers illnesses and injuries that occurred during your RI/ VRS program.
- This insurance does NOT cover your chronic disease.
- If you are not satisfied with the coverage (see the chart on the right), you are responsible for obtaining suitable health and liability insurance. If you arrange your own insurance, please contact gs-relocation@oist.jp.
- Since the insurance company reviews and decides on the claim, you may not receive 100 % of the claimed amount.

2 National Health Insurance

(NHI; also known as "Kokuho")

This applies to holders of a "Cultural Activity" visa who will stay at OIST for more than three months

- Required to enroll in this insurance when registering at the Municipal Office.
- Coverage will be retroactively applied from your date of entry into Japan upon registration.
- 70% of the total medical costs are covered by the National Health Insurance; you will pay the remaining 30%.
- Monthly premium: approximately JPY1,000 -1,500 per month.
- The program includes:
 - A reimbursement system for medical expenses exceeding your individual limit in a single month.
 - If hospitalization or similar treatment is required, you can apply for and receive an eligibility certificate that allows you to pay only up to your individual limit at the hospital.
- > You MAY claim reimbursement under your travel insurance for the 30% you paid.
- The final insurance fee will be adjusted at the time of deregistration.



3. Gakkensai / Gakkenbai

What is "Gakkensai and Gakkenbai"

Insurances covering students against unexpected accidents in the course of their educational and research activities.


